**Glenneyre Street Complete Streets** - The City Council recently approved plans and awarded a contract for the installation of enhanced crosswalks, bike route signage, and sharrows on Glenneyre Street from Park Avenue to Bluebird Canyon Drive. That work began last week and will be completed by the end of this week.

**Laguna Art Museum Art and Nature Event** - The Laguna Art Museum is holding its “Art and Nature” event this weekend, November 7 – 10. The event will feature sand artist Jim Denevan, who will create a geometrical drawing in the sand along the entire length of Main Beach (the sand art will not limit public access to the beach in any way). With the help of several Laguna Beach High School student volunteers, the artist will trace the completed drawing with solar lanterns so it is visible after dark. **Library Internet Service** - The County of Orange is in the process of updating the technology infrastructure at libraries around the county to allow for faster internet service. The County has indicated that it is working with Verizon on the improvements to the Laguna Beach library, which are anticipated to be completed in early 2014.

**Animal Shelter Temporary Closure** – On Monday, November 11, 2013 through Sunday, November 17, 2013, the Laguna Beach Animal Shelter will be temporarily closed while the kennel floors are resurfaced. This was a project approved by the City Council earlier in the year to correct the rough surfaces that were not healthy for our furry guests. The public can still contact the Shelter staff by coming to the front counter of the Police Department where they will be available to answer questions and issue licenses.
