An application has been submitted by Kelly Dye to obtain an Artist Occupancy Permit to work and live at 20412 Laguna Canyon Road, Studio 109 (ArtLofts). The application describes the applicants works as:

"I work across several mediums, but my focus now (and for the next few years) will be textile design and collaborative design with artisan groups. My area of expertise is ethical/sustainable design. I created and currently curate a brick and mortar, ethical/sustainable lifestyle destination in Santa Fe, NM called Folklore. It's part shop, part immersive experience. I design many of the handmade wares we sell in collaboration with local and global artisans."

Occupancy of an Artist Live Workspace is governed by Municipal Code Section 25.16.030 which outlines the following:

The use and occupancy of an artist's working and living unit shall be for artists and their household. Each artist who proposes to occupy an artist working and living unit shall first obtain written confirmation from the community development director or designee, that the type of proposed artwork to be created is appropriate in the proposed zoning designation where the unit is located. A completed application for an artist occupancy permit may then be submitted to the community development department for review and consideration by the artist review panel. In addition, each artist who may potentially occupy an artist working and living unit shall comply with not less than three of the following requirements when submitting a completed application:

- (A) Submit evidence of a body of work, created in the last three years, as documented in support materials such as compact disks (CDs), slides, video and/or audio tapes, production photographs, scripts or works of fiction, non-fiction, or poetry. Support materials shall be labeled with the artist's name, date of work and any other required information.
- (B) Submit evidence that the artist has formal training in the arts, as documented in a resume that summarizes such training.
- (C) Submit evidence that the artist has presented his or her work in exhibition, performance, readings, or comparable public programming, as documented in a resume, sample programs/invitations, catalogs, press clips or similar official documentation.

(D) Submit three letters of recommendation from artists and/or arts professionals (such as curators, producers, or teachers) who are recognized within the arts community and who will attest that the applicant is a working artist as defined below.

- Folklore is a shop/immersive lifestyle space that I created in Santa Fe, NM and I opened to the public in November 2019. The environment itself is a living showcase of my design sensibilities. The interior reflects my airy, pared-down, contemporary lens on the desert southwest. My love and incorporation of vintage textiles Moroccan, Indian, Japanese, and Mexican give the space an eclectic, global flair. Folklore's curation is my vision for beautiful, ethical, sustainable living. The visual experience of the space celebrates and elevates the art of everyday objects whether that be a hand-pinched ceramic bowl made with local micaceous clay; a hand-woven, hand-spun cotton blanket naturally dyed with plants; or a pair of slashed vintage Levi's stunningly mended with Sashiko stitching. When the most fundamental, common objects in one's environment a bowl, a blanket, a pair of blue jeans are true works of art and a space is filled exclusively with soulful items, something magical happens. A palpably serene energy, that is both incredibly soothing to the nervous system and enlivening for the senses, permeates an individual's experience of themselves and the world around them. There is a presence and connectivity that occurs, facilitated by the reverence these conscious objects inspire. The integrity of each object contributes to a holistic integrity in living. This all translates to a slowing down and cultivation of joy in routine. It's this intangible experience that I'm most interested in encapsulating and invoking with my work whether in designing environments or functional art.
