Recap of Minutes

1) Donna Ballard called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

2) The minutes of the September 11, 2023, meeting were approved as presented. M/S Kollenda/Chauvel.

3) Chair's Announcements: None.

- 4) Commissioner and Staff Communications: Pat Kollenda congratulated Staff Poeschl on 26 years of employment with the City. Staff Wood noted attending the fallen officer memorial service. Staff McGregor noted a successful Sunset Serenades concert on September 22, 2023, and the Juried Fine Art exhibition had been installed at City Hall. Staff Poeschl noted the joint City Council and Arts Commission meeting would be rescheduled to February 27, 2024. Staff noted that the meeting on October 23 had been cancelled due to lack of agenda items. Staff noted artist Beau Stanton would begin his installation of "Coalescence" at the flood channel walkway on October 2, 2023. Staff noted Pacific Symphony had been promoting their concert at Heisler Park on October 6, 2023. Staff Poeschl thanked Staff McGregor and Wood for their work coordinating concerts and public art restorations. Mayor Pro-Tem Kempf commended the mural "Super Natural Bloom" by DABSMYLA.

- 6) Items for Discussion and Action:
- A) Art in Public Places 1369 North Coast Highway Property representative Neel Desai described the proposal, presented visual samples, and introduced artist Rahul Jhobalia. Mr. Jhobalia described the proposed sculpture materials of ribboned stainless steel. Donna Ballard noted rust and maintenance issues with a recent City public artwork originally made of the same material. Pat Kollenda requested actual material samples. The Commission requested the artist return with a defined singular proposal instead of a general concept. The item was continued.
- B) Youth Art Advisory Board Staff McGregor presented the statements of interest and relevant experience of the Youth Art Advisory Board applicants. A motion was made to appoint Hannah Miller, Charley Jerabek, and Luci Pina to the Youth Art Advisory Board. M/S Kollenda/Ervin. Yeas: Ballard, Barrow, Chauvel, Ervin, Kollenda, Schwerner, Smith. Title: 1369 North Coast Highway Art in Public Places Application

Overview

The property located at 1369 North Coast Highway is a new commercial and industrial building being developed by TLB LLC who have elected to install artwork to satisfy the Municipal Code requirement of Chapter 1.09 Art -in Public Places. (LINK to the Municipal Code)

Summary of the Matter

The artwork entitled "Sea Breeze Symphony" is a sculpture consisting of multiple interwoven two-inch stainless-steel ribbons primed and spray painted with metallic paint. The sculpture by artist Rahul Jobalia will measure 5 feet in height by 7 feet 4 inches in width by 6 inches in depth, mounted 12 inches from the ground on an exterior cement wall facing North Coast Highway. The sculpture will have a 2-inch top and bottom anchoring system made of galvanized stainless steel with additional anchoring into the wall. The sculpture will be finished in turquoise, orange, and steel patina, with a gloss finish. Each of these three ribbons represents a different aspect of Laguna Beach's character as described in the application. The sculpture will be lit by existing LED lighting. Maintenance will be facilitated by the property owner and is anticipated to be cleaning and refreshing the paint every 5-7 years as needed.

Update

Neel Desai and Rahul Jobalia, Artist, presented the proposal to the Arts Commission on September 25, 2023. The matter was continued. The Arts Commission asked the applicant to return with a representative small-scale model in the proposed materials and requested additional details of past similar work by the artist. The September 29, 2023 submission herein includes more detailed information of the proposed installation, but not the artist's previous works. The updated application proposes a single metallic color rather than the three colors previously noted. Mr. Desai indicated they will bring the model with them to present and answer remaining questions at the October 9, 2023 Arts Commission meeting.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Arts Commission hear the updated presentation and consider the application.

Description: "Sea Breeze Symphony" is a dynamic and elegant art sculpture that captures the essence of Laguna Beach. The sculpture consists of multiple stainless steel ribbons or waves flowing in a graceful, interweaving manner. Each ribbon represents a different aspect of Laguna Beach's character:

- Wave of Nature: one ribbon depicts the undulating curves and forms of ocean waves, symbolizing the city's stunning coastline and its harmonious relationship with the Pacific Ocean.
- Brushstroke of Artistry: another ribbon takes the form of a paintbrush stroke or a calligraphy brush, representing Laguna Beach's thriving artistic community and its rich heritage in various art forms.
- Sunbeam of Radiance: A ribbon of curves and twists like a sunbeam, symbolizing the abundant sunshine and the golden light that bathes Laguna Beach, creating a warm and inviting atmosphere.




The sculpture will be mounted on the wall allowing residents and visitors to appreciate its fluid and captivating design. The stainless steel material ensures durability and reflects the surrounding environment, mimicking the interplay of light on the oceans surface.




Material: the "ribbons" will be made in steel, primed and painted with metallic paint. The "Wave of Nature" will be painted in a turquoise color. The "Brushstroke of artistry" will remain in the steel color and finally the "Sunbeam of Radiance" will be painted in a orange color representing a setting sun


Maintenance: Since the piece will be made in steel and the colors on the piece will be primed and painted, there will be minimal maintenance. The piece will need some dusting which the regular association will take care of but other than that there may be some repainting needed every 5-7 years (if necessary).

Overview

The Holiday Palette Competition is open to artists who reside, work, or exhibit in Laguna Beach and are 18 years and older. The painted original artworks adorn lampposts throughout the city during the winter holiday season. Design submissions for the competition were received through October 2, 2023. The Arts Commission has the materials and budget for the selection of up to four (4) designs. Completed palette designs become property of the City of Laguna Beach and are displayed when and where the City desires for up to 7 years or based on its condition.

The sub-committee has reviewed the submitted palette designs and may provide an oral recommendation.
